




Starting on April 2nd 2022, Piero Atchugarry Gallery Miami will host the exhibition 50 Years, a Day. Studio la Città, a Story. Given the competitive nature of the art world, this exhibition constitutes an absolute oddity: an open dedication from gallerist to gallerist, and a tribute to 50 years of Studio la Città, which has contributed to defining the history of contemporary art in Italy.

Studio la Città was founded in 1969 in Verona by Hélène de Franchis. As Marco Meneguzzo – curator of the show - said: the role of a successful gallery owner imposes tiring rhythms, usually driven by the desire to assert one's own taste rather than by any economic consideration. This is the only reason why one can resist for so long: it is an inner drive that determines the initial action, not the reasoning.

Today, the different phases of the extensive career of Hélène de Franchis, the core of Studio la Città, arrive in Miami. The exhibition brings overseas pieces that constitute a unique self-portrait of the gallery owner: choices that have contributed to identifying the mainstream of contemporary art today, other choices that are more personal, but never trivial or ephemeral, and which could contribute to future researches in the still under-explored "pleats" of art history. By hosting a homage to a fellow gallerist, the exhibition introduces a continued development in the collaborative model that Piero Atchugarry Gallery has adopted in recent years. The result is a retrospective exhibition with carefully selected works including emblematic pieces by Stuart Arends, Gabriele Basilico, Pier Paolo Calzolari, Lawrence Carroll, Vincenzo Castella, Lynn Davis, Lucio Fontana, Alberto Garutti, Herbert Hamak, Jacob Hashimoto, Igino Legnaghi, David Leverett, Emil Lukas, Giulio Paolini, Michelangelo Pistoletto, David Simpson and Ettore Spalletti.







(b. 1950)


Stuart Arends was born in Waterloo in 1950, Iowa. He lives and works in Willard, New Mexico.

The common element of his entire work is the research, using different techniques, on the infinite possibilities of abstraction and on how to expand and enrich it through his works of art: wax, paper and wood, among others materials used by the artist, are investigated in their ambiguity and physicality through the stratification and the research on the material.

His works have been seen in numerous group and solo shows throughout the world and have been acquired by the most important international public and private collections, including the Whitney Museum of American Art (New York); the Corcoran Gallery of Art (Washington, D.C.); the New Mexico Museum of Fine Art (Santa Fe, New Mexico) and, In Italy, the MART (Rovereto) and the Panza Collection (Milan-Varese).

Arends has been awarded a Pollock-Krasner Foundation Grant.

Gabriele Basilico (b. 1944)

Gabriele Basilico was born in Milan. After his graduation in the early seventies in Architecture, he starts photographing the city and the urban landscape.

His first major exhibition, "Milano, ritratti di fabbriche", inaugurates at the PAC (Padiglione d'Arte Contemporanea) in Milan.

His first international assignment. Basilico is invited to participate in the Mission Photographique of the D.A.T.A.R., a major French government project involving a group of international photographers, commissioned to interpret the transformation of the contemporary French landscape. From then on, the city and the urban landscape will be constant themes in his research. Throughout the years, he has developed a large number of photographic projects and publications, both for his own research and for commissions, presenting his work in many international museums and galleries.

Pier Paolo Calzolari


(b. 1943)

Lives and works in Lisbon, Portugal.

Born in Bologna in 1943, Calzolari spent his childhood and adolescence in Venice, whose Byzantine artistic heritage and unique light left a deep trace on the sensitivity of the future artist. In 1965, he returned to Bologna and opened a studio in Palazzo Bentivoglio, where he produced his first paintings and hosted exhibitions by other artists. He presented the first 8mm and super8 films by Ari Marcopoulos, Andy Warhol, Jonas Mekas and Mario Schifano and met people such as Allen Ginsberg, Julian Beck, Luigi Ontani, Raymond Hains and Chet Baker. In 1966-1967 he created the first of his performance works (Il filtro e benvenuto all'angelo), which saw the audience participate directly in the work and which Calzolari himself defined as an "activation of space", according to a work technique typical of his later production, titled the "atti di passion" (acts of passion).

Between 1967, the year he moved to Urbino, and 1972 Calzolari traveled between Paris, New York and Berlin and developed his artistic project, establishing the parameters of his plastic vocabulary. During this period Calzolari was incorporated into the Arte Povera movement and his work "La casa ideale" (1968), which found completion in a group of works, is considered to be one of the essential enunciations of the Arte Povera movement. In those years he produced a broad series of works with icy structures and neon, such as "Oroscopo come progetto della mia vita" (1968) and the series "Gesti"(1968-1969) in which the formation of frost on the forms, marked by the time passing, is an indication of the alchemical transformation process of matter. In this way, the objects and materials that the artist had been using since 1967 (fire, ice, lead, tin, salt, moss, tobacco) were given a second life alongside luminous elements, echoes of the brilliance of Venetian marble.

Calzolari's aesthetic dimension - which takes shape through paintings, sculptures, texts, sound recordings, videos, performances, the involvement of people and animals, architecture and light, and a profound diversification of materials - is difficult to circumscribe or recompose in a project that is still ongoing: "No formal consideration," writes Catherine David, "can account for an experience whose dimension is restored in all its states."

Lawrence Carroll

(b. 1954-2019)

Born in Melbourne in 1954, Lawrence Carroll spent his childhood in California and studied at the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena.

Lawrence Carroll's paintings are more like painted objects than canvases in their traditional two-dimensional sense. The work cannot be approached in its entirety from a frontal standpoint as its composition and structure conceal several levels of readings. They are closer to being painterly constructions in which Lawrence Carroll integrates objects, either within the structure of the work or on the surface. The latter are comprised of inlays and layers that create a surface architecture of forms that are cobbled together or "repaired", as the artist likes to say. Lawrence Carroll deploys an "aesthetic of scraps" by using ordinary objects and scraps in his works such as old, patched-up shoes, flowers coated in paint, bits of bread or canvas and paper glued or stapled to the surface of his paintings. At first the works appear monochromatic with light tones, but reveal diverse nuances ranging from beige to brown, blue and yellow.

In 1988 his first solo show was presented in New York followed by his first international exhibition, together with Joseph Beuys, Bruce Nauman and Robert Ryman among others, curated by Harald Szeeman at the Deichtorhallen in Hamburg, Germany. Many international solo exhibitions followed at the Kölnischer Kunstverein (1994), the Städtische Galerie im Museum Folkwang in Essen (1994) at the Guggenheim Museum in New York (1995), the MoCA in Los Angeles (2000), the Hotel des Arts in Toulon (2007), the Museo Correr in Venice (2008). He participated in the documenta 9 in Kassel and at the Venice Biennale 2013 at the Pavilion of the Holy See. His works are exhibited in several international public collections including the Guggenheim in New York, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Los Angeles, the National Museum of Modern Art in Tokyo and the Museum Folkwang Essen (1994). Lawrence Carroll died in May 2019 in Cologne, Germany.

Vincenzo Castella

(b. 1952)

Vincenzo Castella (Naples 1952) lives and works in Milan.

The artist has used colour photography since 1975 and in 1998, he began his series about buildings in which he undertakes visual narratives dealing with the complexity of the fabric and the interactions of cities; these are in the form of large and extremely large colour prints. His interest is in the concepts of distance and dislocation.

Since 2006 he has constructed video installations derived from large photographic negatives: Cronache da Milano, realised in 2007/2008 and presented at Art Unlimited - Basel 2009 with Studio la Città. In 2009 he created About Town, centred on Amsterdam. The various photographic analyses give us an unambiguous overview of the relationships between the visible and invisible in city life, suggesting a visual re-editing of the complexity of the fabric and interactions of cities.

His work has been presented in European institutional venues (among which Arles - Mont Majour Abbey, Sandretto Re Rebaudengo Foundation - Guarene, Villa Manin Museum in Passariano). His works have been exhibited in important exhibitions such as: Innesti. Grafting, 14th International Architecture Exhibition – Venice Biennale (2014), Intuition, at Palazzo Fortuny, Venice (2017), Studio eine Phantastik at the Shedhalle in Zurich (2018).

Lynn Davis (b. 1944)

Lynn Davis was born in Minneapolis in 1944 and lives and works in New York.

After arriving in New York in 1974, Lynn Davis started an apprenticeship with Berenice Abbott (1898 - 1991).

1979 was the year of her recognition: she had the opportunity of exhibiting nudes and portraits at the ICP of the International Center of Photography together with Robert Mapplethorpe. Since the beginning, her photography has been characterized by a focus on formal rules, first applied to the human figure and then, since the 1980s, to landscapes and monuments. Her photos are elegiac, abstract and perfectly composed.

Lynn Davis' photographs have been shown in numerous solo and group exhibitions and her works are part of important collections such as those of the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the Chicago Museum of Contemporary Art, the Houston Museum of Fine Arts and the J. Paul Getty Museum.

Lucio Fontana

(b. 1899-1968)

Lucio Fontana was an Argentine-Italian painter, sculptor and theorist. He is mostly known as the founder of Spatialism.

Born in Rosario, province of Santa Fe, Argentina to Italian immigrant parents, he was the son of the sculptor Luigi Fontana (1865 — 1946). Fontana spent the first years of his life in Argentina and then was sent to Italy in 1905, where he stayed until 1922, working as a sculptor with his father, and then on his own. Already in 1926, he participated in the first exhibition of Nexus, a group of young Argentine artists working in Rosario de Santa Fé.

Lucio Fontana is one of the great interpreters of twentieth century Italian sculpture. He is part of the great sculptural tradition begun by Medardo Rosso, and then continued by the Futurists and Martini. In 1935 Fontana began his experiments with ceramic sculpture, finding new possibilities for material-form, a foretaste of the great material-space revolution he was to spark off at the end of the 1940s.

Alberto Garutti (b. 1948)

Born in Galbiate (Lecco) in 1948, he lives and works in Milan.


Artist and lecturer, he teaches at the IUAV in Venice in the Department of Design and Art. He has been a lecturer at the Architecture Department of Milan Politecnico and until 2013 he taught as Professor of painting at the Brera Academy of Fine Arts in Milan.

Invited to major international events, such as the Venice Biennale in 1990, the Istanbul Biennale in 2001 and the Memory Marathon at the Serpentine Gallery in London in 2012, he is often commissioned to create public works for cities and museums: as in Ghent, Belgium for the SMAK on the occasion of the Over the Edges exhibition (2000), in Kanazawa, Japan (2002) in collaboration with the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, in Herford, Germany for the MARTa Museum (2003), in Moscow for the Moscow Museum of Modern Art in the context of the Impossible Community exhibition (2011) and in Milan in the Porta Nuova district commissioned by Hines Italia (2012).

In 2019, Alberto Garutti created three large permanent works near Caorle (Venice), after winning an international art competition held by Assicurazioni Generali - Genagricola S.p.A. in 2017, and a site-specific work for the new MAXXI headquarters in L'Aquila.

He realises permanent works capable of triggering relationships and connections between public, private institutions and the social fabric of the city. This approach is reflected in the works "Ai nati oggi" for the cities of Rome, Bergamo, Ghent, Istanbul, Moscow and Plovdiv, Piccolo Museion in Bolzano (in collaboration with Museion), as well as in Trivero with the work conceived for the Fondazione Zegna in 2009, in Cagliari for the Tiscali headquarters in 2003, in Antwerp with the work "Tutti i passi", in the spaces of Malpensa Airport and Stazione Cadorna in Milan, in Piazza di Santa Maria Novella in Florence and at the LAC in Lugano.



Herbert Hamak (b. 1952)

Herbert Hamak was born in Unterfranken in 1952. He lives and works in Hammelburg.

His are not usual works of sculpture: buildings, their façade and spaces are at the base of his researches into colour, he uses them as a painter uses a canvas on a stretcher. One of the key aspects of his art is of passage: a state of passage and of a condition in which colour and three-dimensionality in space live together in perfect harmony. His most recent work have more complex forms than the earlier ones: there are further allusions to architectural glimpse, as well as forms reminiscent of Renaissance painting.

Among his most recent exhibitions, mention should be made of a solo show at Kenji Taki Gallery, Tokyo – Nagoya in 2018 and in 2017 At The End of The Rainbow, organised by Studio la Città in Milano. The Adventure of Our Collection I at the Kaiser Wilhelm Museum, Krefeld, 2016 and, in the same year, Un racconto in sei stanze at Palazzo Barbò, Torre Pallavicina; Il Tesoro misterioso at the Maffeiana museum, Verona, 2015 and, in the same year at Studio la Città, Verona, Point Alpha; his solo shows in 2013 at the Xippas gallery, Paris, and the Tanit gallery, Munich; and his exhibition at the Museum Haus Lange, Krefeld, curated by Martin Hentschel. Among his major interventions in public spaces mention should be made of the installations in the new headquarters of Bocconi University, Milan, in 2008; Archiginnasio, Bologna, in 2008; Castelvecchio museum, Verona, in 2007; and on the façade of Atri cathedral, Teramo, in 2003.


Jacob Hashimoto (b. 1973)

Jacob Hashimoto was born in Greeley, Colorado in 1973 and is a graduate of The School of the Art Institute of Chicago. He lives and works in Ossining, New York.

Using sculpture, painting, and installation, Jacob Hashimoto creates complex worlds from a range of modular components: bamboo-and-paper kites, model boats, even astroturf-covered blocks. His accretive, layered compositions reference video games, virtual environments, and cosmology, while also remaining deeply rooted in art-historical traditions notably, landscape-based abstraction, modernism, and handcraft.

Hashimoto has been featured in museum exhibitions at MOCA Pacific Design Center in Los Angeles, MACRO - Museum of Contemporary Art in Rome, Fondazione Querini Stampalia in Venice, LACMA - Los Angeles County Museum of Art in California, Schauwerk Sindlefingen in Germany, Wäinö Aaltonen Museum of Art in Finland, Galleria d'Arte Moderna "Achille Forti" in Italy, Museo di Storia Naturale in Italy, Site Santa Fe in New Mexico, Science Museum of Oklahoma and the Crow Museum of Asian Art in Texas. He has also had solo shows at Mary Boone Gallery in New York, Rhona Hoffman Gallery in Chicago, Studio la Città in Verona, Galerie Forsblom in Helsinki, Anglim Gilbert Gallery in San Francisco, and Makasiini Contemporary in Turku, among others. 

Igino Legnaghi (b. 1936)

Igino Legnaghi was born in Verona in 1936. He went to the Nani art school and, at the same time, the Cignaroli academy of fine art in Verona. While still very young, he learned how to work with metal in the workshop of his father, a silversmith and engraver. In 1966 he took part in the XXIII Venice Biennale in the decorative arts section and, in 1967, he held his first solo show at the Galleria Ferrari in Verona; in 1970 he exhibited at the Galleria del Cavallino in Venice. From 1967 to 1969 he lived in the United States, where he made a metal mural for the New School Art Center in New York; he also exhibited some works at the Chicago Art Institute.

His first solo show at Studio la Città was in 1971 and, in the same year, he took part in the group show titled Sguardo a Nord-Est curated by Giuseppe Marchiori and Alessandro Mozzambani. Successively, with the same gallery, he took part in various important public shows, among which one at Palazzo Te in Mantua in 1982; in the same year he held a solo show at the Achille Forti Gallery of Modern and Contemporary Art, and at Palazzo della Gran Guardia in Verona, both with catalogue presentations by Licisco Magagnato, the farsighted director of the city's museums. There should also be noted an anthological show of his work in 1973 at the Camden Arts Centre in London, with catalogue essays by Charles Spencer, Pierre Restany, and Maurizio Fagiolo Dell'Arco. His works are to be found in the major Italian and foreign collections, and they have recently been exhibited at the Galleria Lorenzelli Arte in Milan.





David Leverett

(b. 1938)

David Leverett was born in Nottingham in 1938. He lives in London.

Before becoming well known for his abstract acrylic paintings and his collages, David Leverett had studied at the Nottingham college of art (1957-61) and at the Royal Academy (1961-64). He worked as a designer and set designer before turning to painting and beginning a career as a teacher. In 1966 he held his first solo show at the Redfern Gallery in London.

His work reflects his continuous attention to landscape, partly in order to reflect our identity in the world, and partly to draw attention to the notable dynamics of the natural environment on which we depend. His works have been part of important group shows centred on "pittura pittura" or pure painting, among which the famous exhibition Empirica, curated by Giorgio Cortenova for Museo di Castelvecchio in Verona (1975) and later installed in Rimini. His first solo show at Studio la Città was in 1971 and later, represented by the same gallery, he took part in numerous exhibitions abroad (for example, in Athens, Berlin, and London). At the end of the 1970s he exhibited at the Tate Gallery, London, and with the British Arts Council. His works are to be found in important international public and private collections.





Emil Lukas

(b. 1964)


Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in 1964, Emil Lukas has exhibited throughout the United States and abroad.

Solo museum shows include "Emil Lukas: Connection to the Curious" at The Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum in Ridgefield, CT (2005); "Emil Lukas" at The Weatherspoon Museum, Greensboro, NC (2005); "Things with Wings," The Mattress Factory, Pittsburgh, PA (2005); and "Moderate Climate and the Bitter Bison" at the Hunterdon Museum, Hunterdon, NJ (2008). In 2016, a solo exhibition of his work was held at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, Philadelphia, PA. Lukas' work has been featured in group shows at the Musée d'Art Moderne de la Ville de Paris (1995), Museo di arte moderna e contemporanea di Trento e Rovereto (1996); Contemporary Arts Museum, Houston (1998); Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, Kansas City (1999); American Academy, Rome (2000); The Drawing Center, New York (2002); and SCAD Museum of Art, Savannah (2012-13).

His work is in important private and public collections, including the Panza Collection, Italy; the Dakis Joannou Collection, Greece; the Anderson Collection at Stanford University; Baltimore Museum of Art; Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art, Bentonville, AR; Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego; Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, Philadelphia; San Francisco Museum of Modern Art; UBS Art Collection; and Weatherspoon Art Museum, Greensboro, NC.

Emil Lukas has been represented by Studio la Città since the early 90's with a first one person show in 1993. In the United States he works with Sperone Westwater Gallery, New York and Hosfelt Gallery, San Francisco.

Giulio Paolini (b. 1940)

Giulio Paolini was born in Genoa on the 5th of November 1940, he lives in Turin.

Since he first participated in a group exhibition in 1961 and his first solo show in 1964, he has held countless exhibitions at galleries and museums worldwide.

The major retrospectives include Palazzo della Pilotta in Parma (1976), the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam (1980), the Nouveau Musée in Villeurbanne (1984), the Staatsgalerie in Stuttgart (1986), the Galleria Nazionale d'Arte Moderna in Rome (1988), the Neue Galerie am Landesmuseum Joanneum in Graz (1998), the Fondazione Prada in Milan (2003), the Kunstmuseum in Winterthur (2005) and the Whitechapel Gallery in London (2014).

He has taken part in a number of Arte povera exhibitions, and on several occasions has shown his work at Documenta in Kassel (1972, 1977, 1982, 1992), and at the Venice Biennale (1970, 1976, 1978, 1980, 1984, 1986, 1993, 1995, 1997, 2013). His work is represented in many international public collections.

Trained as a graphic designer he has always had a special interest in the printed page. His artistic research has long been coupled with written statements and reflections collected in artist's books: from Idem, published in 1975 by Einaudi (Turin) with a foreword by Italo Calvino, to Quattro passi. Nel museo senza muse, brought out in 2006 by the same publisher, and L'autore che credeva di esistere, published by Johan & Levi (Milan) in 2012. Since 1969, he has also designed sets and costumes for the theatre, notably projects devised with Carlo Quartucci in the eighties and the recent sets for two Wagner operas directed by Federico Tiezzi (2005, 2007).

Michelangelo Pistoletto (b. 1933)

Michelangelo Pistoletto was born in Biella in 1933.

He began to exhibit his work in 1955 and in 1960 he had his first solo show at Galleria Galatea in Turin.

An inquiry into self-portraiture characterizes his early work. In the two- year period 1961-1962 made the first Mirror Paintings, which directly include the viewer and real time in the work, and open up perspective, reversing the Renaissance perspective that had been closed by the twentieth-century avant-gardes. These works quickly brought Pistoletto international acclaim, leading, in the sixties, to one-man shows in important galleries and museums in Europe and the United States. The Mirror Paintings are the foundation of his subsequent artistic output and theoretical thought.

From 1985 to 1989 he created the series of "dark" volumes called Art of Squalor. During the nineties, with Project Art and with the creation in Biella of Cittadellarte- Fondazione Pistoletto and the University of Ideas, he brought art into active relation with diverse spheres of society with the aim of inspiring and producing responsible social change. In 2003 he won the Venice Biennale's Golden Lion for Lifelong Achievement. In 2004 the University of Turin awarded him a laurea honoris causa in Political Science. On that occasion the artist announced what has become the most recent phase of his work, Third Paradise.

Born in Pasadena, U.S.A. in 1928. He lives and works in Berkeley, California.

Simpson is one of the most important living artists of the Post Painterly movement, which he helped to found with Ellsworth Kelly and Kenneth Noland in the late 1950s.

Ettore Spalletti

(b. 1940-2019)

Ettore Spalletti (1940-2019) was born in Cappelle sul Tavo (Pescara) where he spent his whole life. He began his career when Arte Povera was revolutionizing visual culture in Italy and beyond. Spalletti developed a singular, solitary voice and a resultant body of work that exceeds any movement that circumscribes an artist to regional or ideological boundaries. Spalletti's formal vocabulary has always melded and balanced painting and sculpture, form and color, interior and exterior space. Each work is the result of a meditative but rigorous process of applying a layer of color at the same time of each day, to capture a specific tone that recalls an hour, a season, and the weather
