The Distance of Time

"The gallery in Garzon is intimate while having two long vantage points from the front entrance. For this reason I want to show two types of work, 'Thread' paintings and 'Bubble' paintings. I want to use the space to make the viewer aware of distance and time. A 'Thread' painting from a distance gives no information of what it physically is or how it was made, from close up it reveals everything. 'Bubble' paintings saturate the eye with color and or contrast causing a completely different optic event, using perception over time." Emil Lukas

The work of Emil Lukas (Pittsburgh, 1964) can be regarded as a sustained attempt at challenging time and charming our gaze as a way of posing questions rather than offering answers. Therefore, we will tackle the issue of the ability and the power of this human production of becoming something so special. What can art tell us? Or, perhaps, we may go even further and risk an answer regarding the relationship between art and life.

In his work, Emil Lukas condenses a way of thinking, a will to be in the world that has cemented a unique voice in contemporary art. His aesthetically and artistically challenging body of work features existential concerns that turn our gaze toward ourselves. He expressly refuses to explain his pieces, as they exist and project their power in the realm of the real.

His material production is process-oriented. He uses accessible, albeit uncommon, materials to develop a body of work of an abstract nature that follows a cumulative, experimental logic. His methodology stems from a detailed study of the materials' plastic possibilities and their symbolic potential, along with extensive research on human perception. His vocation has led him to experiment with indeterminate processes and randomness, but also to develop pieces where the position of all the elements involved is decided with meticulous precision.

Lukas explores different forms of abstraction, and his artistic production is in line with that of the artistic movement concerned with perception-related phenomena, whose work seeks to provide a kind of sensitive knowledge and profound physical experiences of transcendental vocation. Through his art, he poses questions and stirs sensations which can be read as both a critical reflection on the mechanisms used to produce images or as metaphors of more universal existential issues.

As a critique to the hypermediated world of images, his aesthetic contribution conveys genuine concerns that nurture and speak to the beholder. Nevertheless, if visitors come craving the immediate impact of advertisements, they are in for a frustrating ride. The appreciation of his work demands time to slow down the eye and prepare oneself physically, mentally, and emotionally in order to venture into the universes of a creator committed to his language and the times he happens to live in.

Every series or body of work included in the exhibition applies a technique or procedure linked to a material that implies some kind of hands-on expertise, a know-how that is at the core of the research that Lukas conducts in his studio in Stockertown, Pennsylvania. Technologically speaking, his work poses challenges in line with the artist's interests: the act of doing something implicitly communicates a way of understanding art and the world. Art and craft come together in series which amalgamate discursively within his universe.

The pieces comprised in the series entitled "Thread Paintings" were created by stretching out thousands of meters of colored threads which were placed by hand over a loom system that is the frame of the piece itself. Lukas creates different patterns: grids conformed by thousands of lines that radiate from an aired center toward a denser perimeter, where the central negative space becomes a center that emits light along with vertical specters that seem to vibrate when the eye pierces them. His work with various densities produces a powerful optical illusion of volume when beheld from a distance. Energetic and fascinating, these pieces are the threshold across which there is a space where light, color and retina meet, in a sort of optical emotion the artist communicates to the beholder.

Emil Lukas' work addresses universal concerns. His pieces offer a sensitive look at the world through an accumulation of experiences. The internal power of his art dazzles with a beauty that is not an end in itself, but a means to glimpse at issues that transcend us. Devoid of pompous speeches, his sensitivity and honesty put us in an essentially human and universal place.

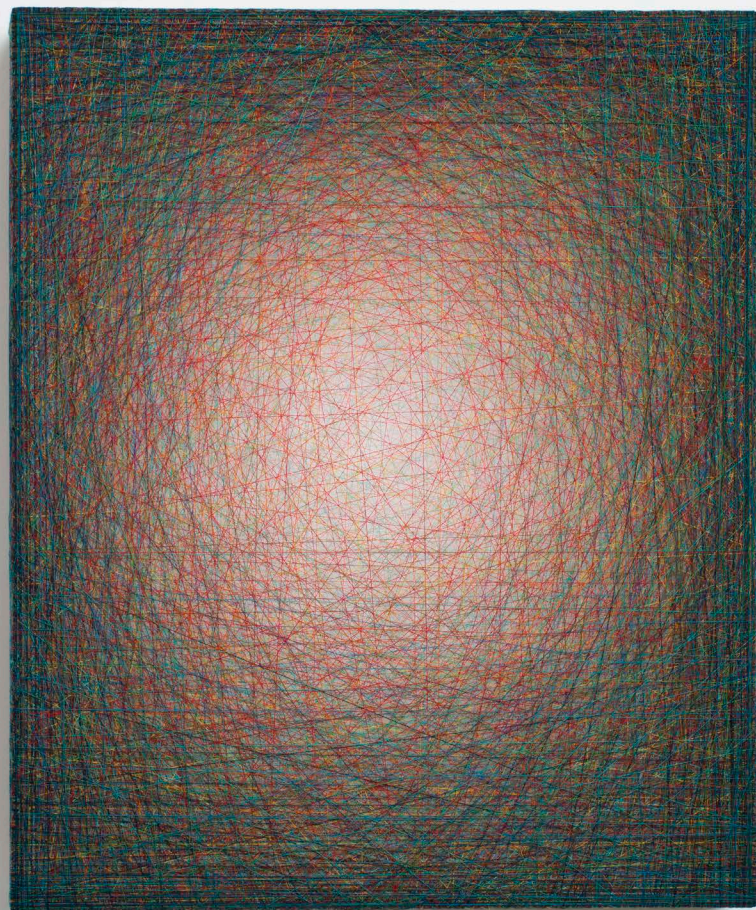

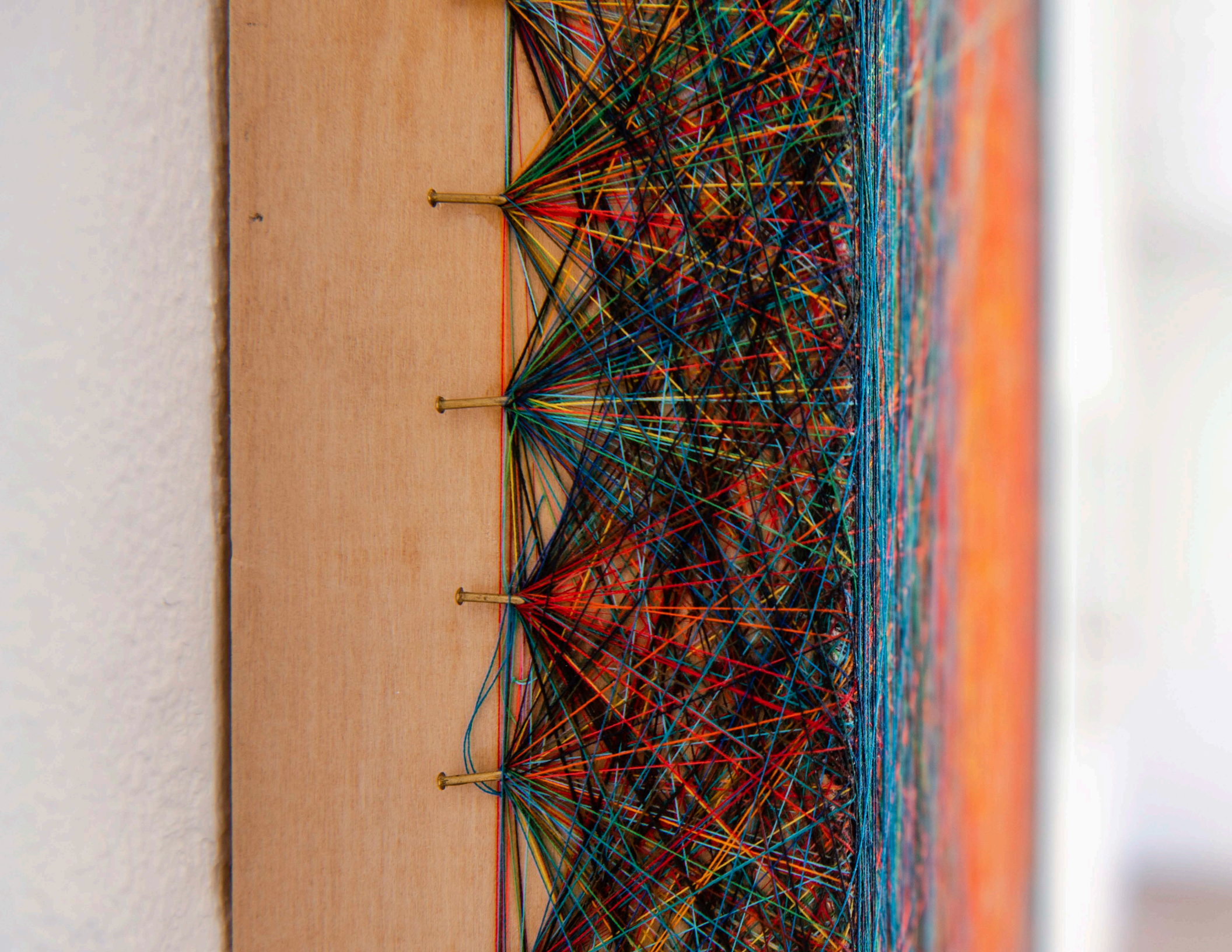

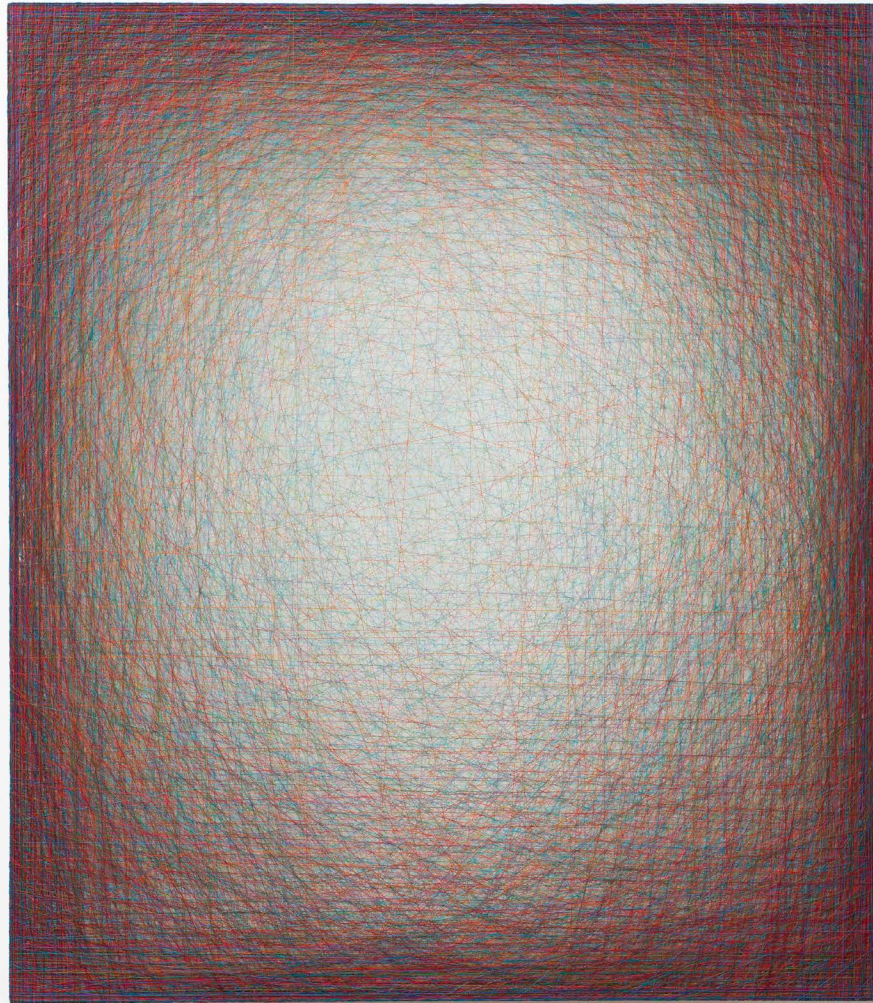


Emil Lukas #2102, 2022

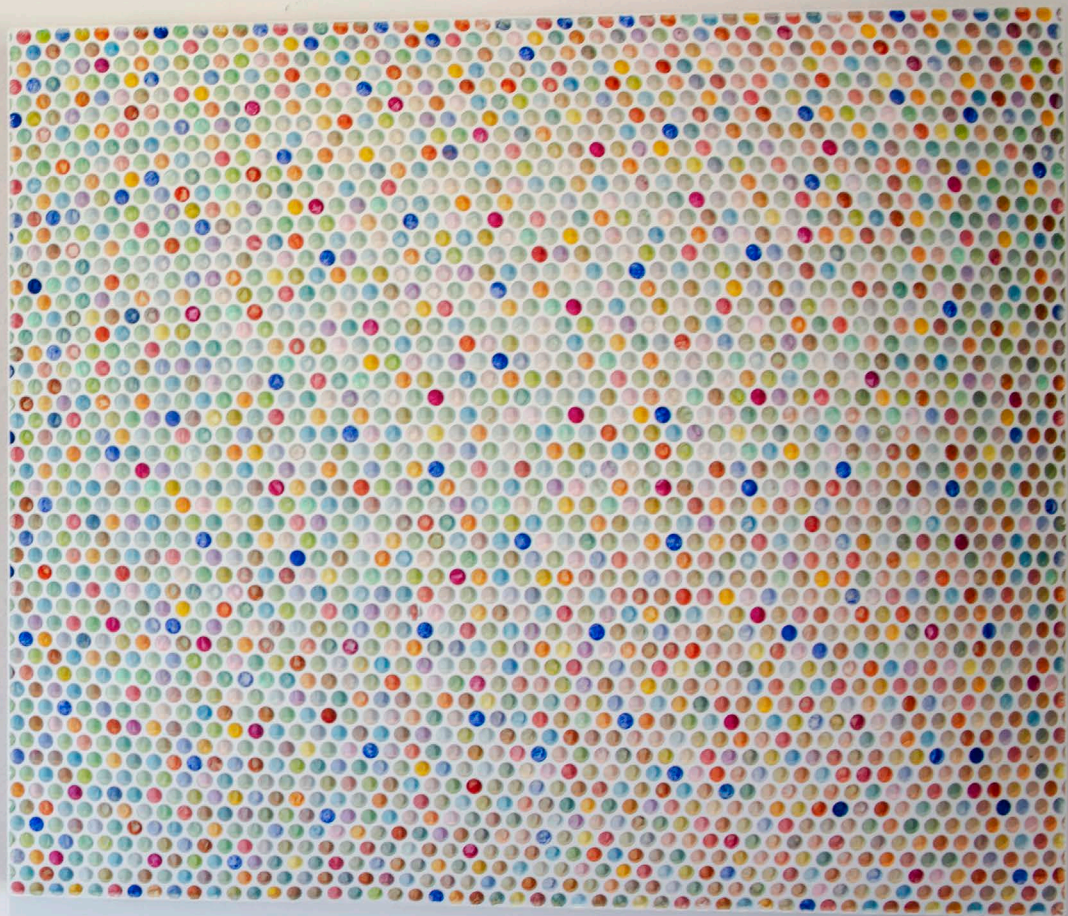

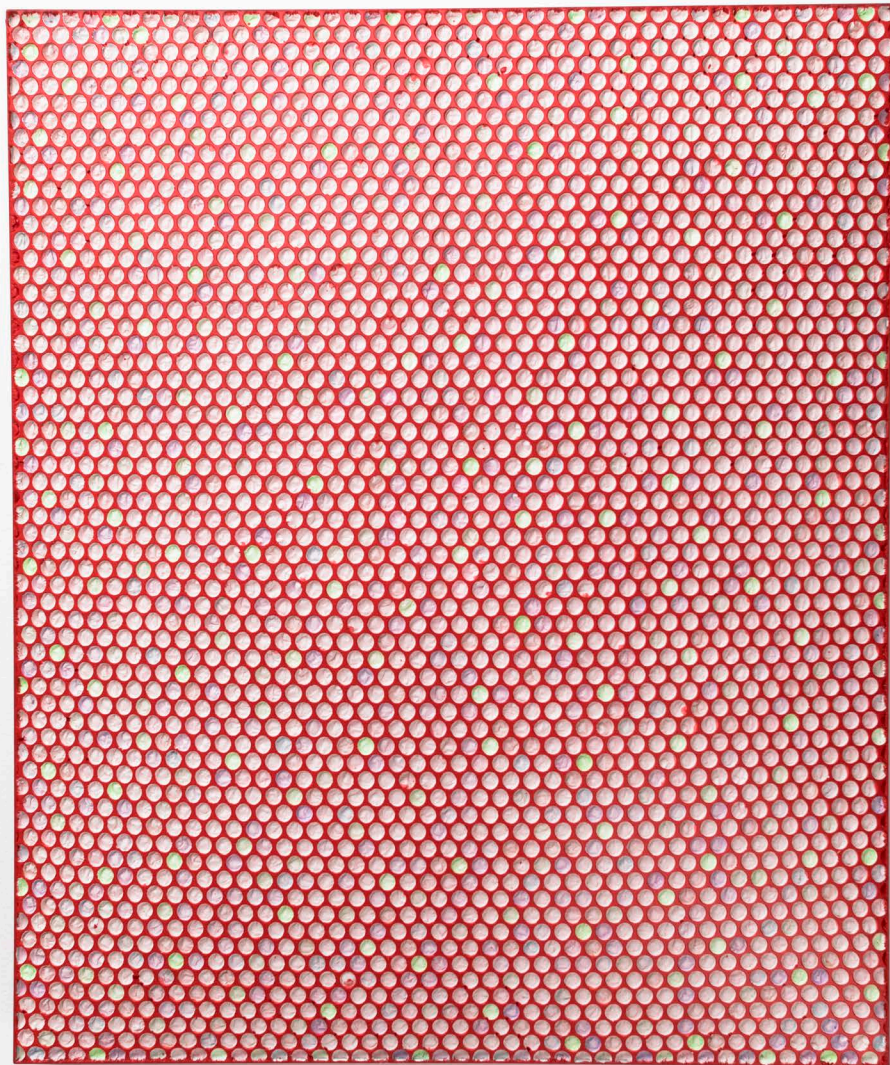

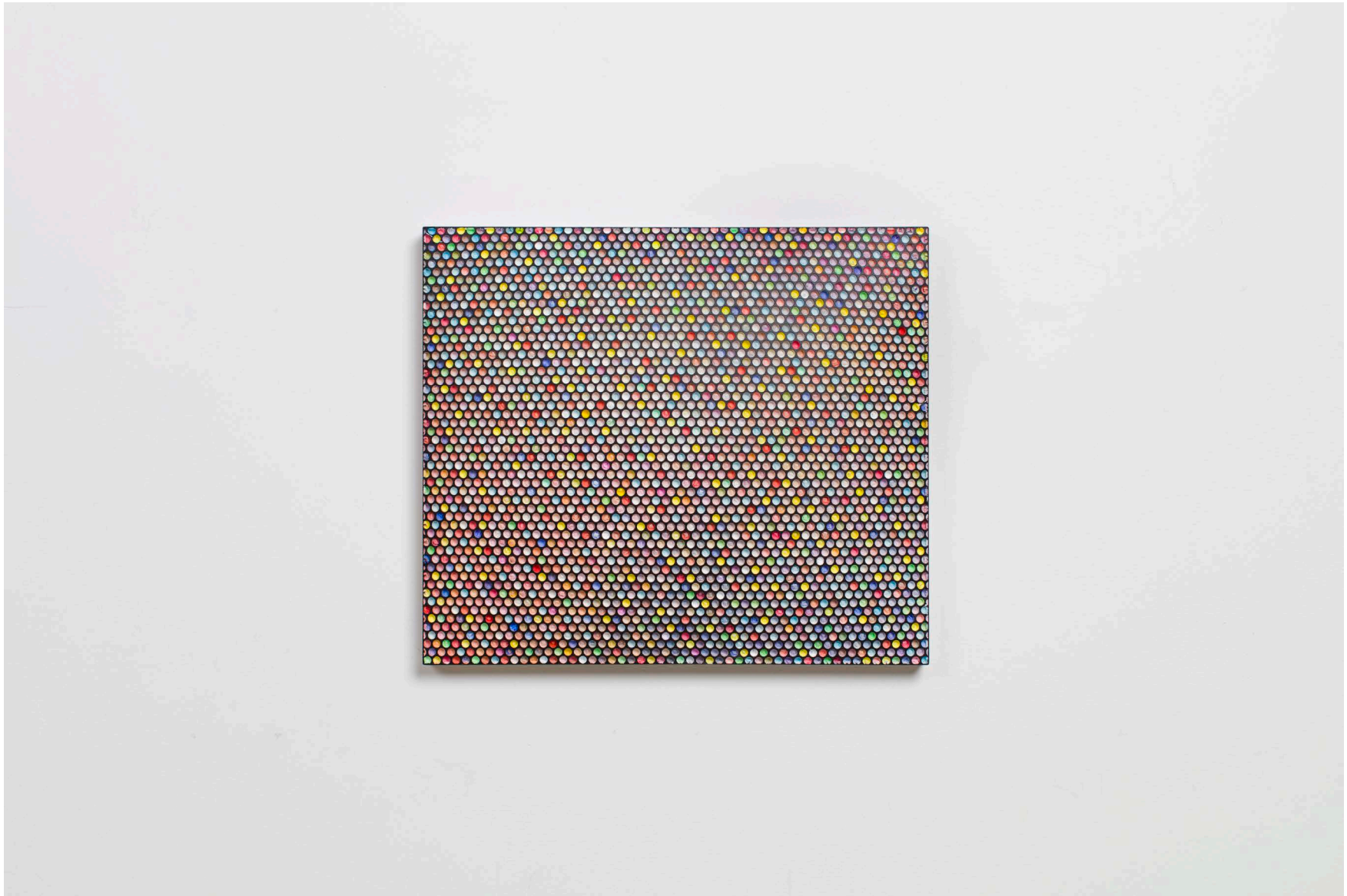


Emil Lukas #2134 *Impossibility of Even Expanse*, 2022

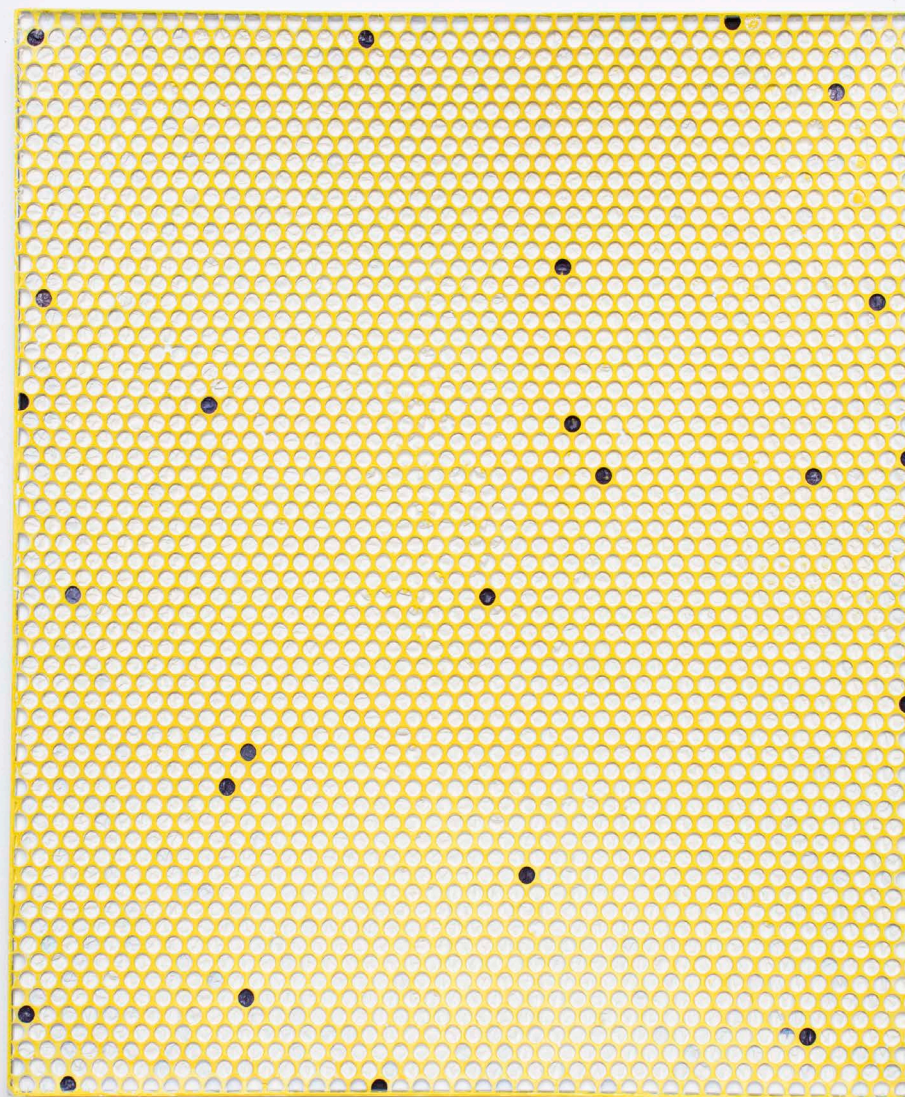

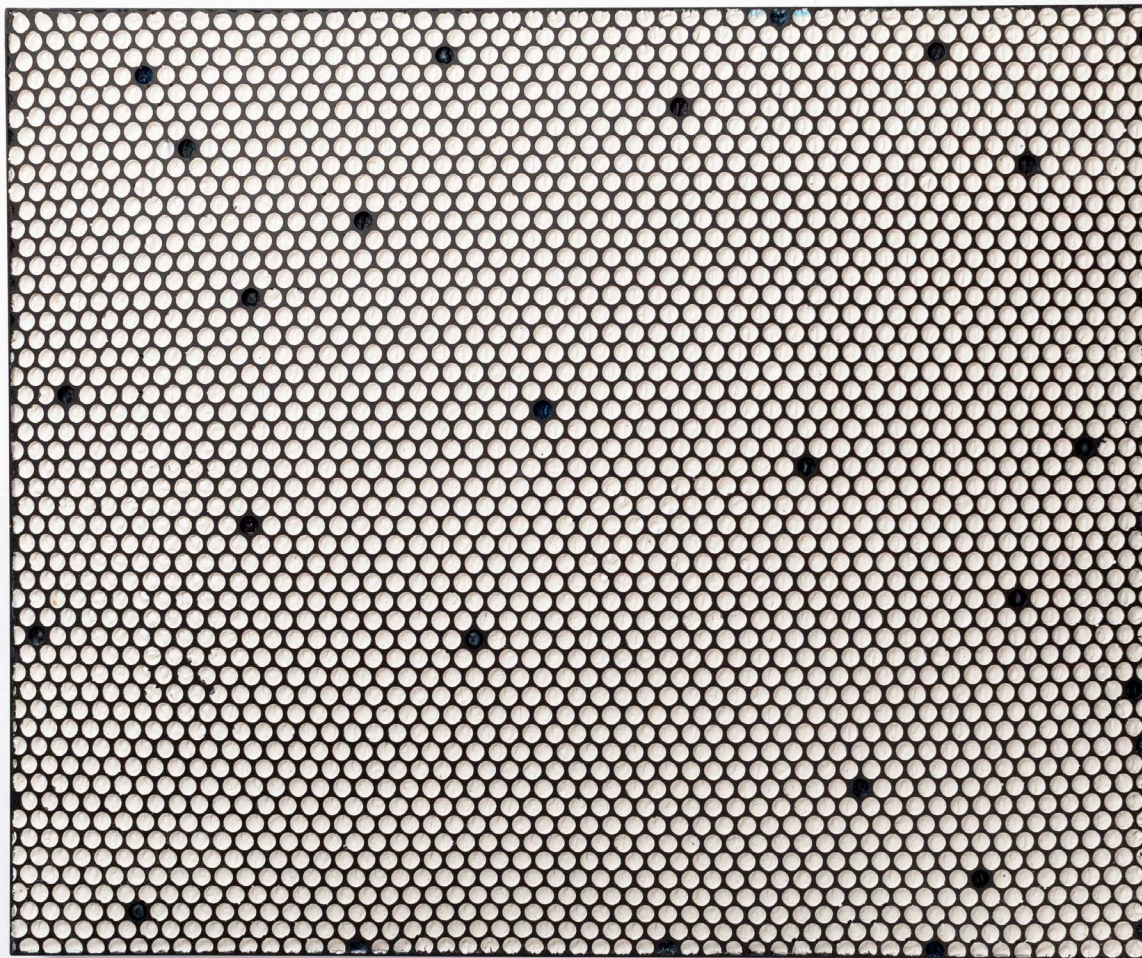

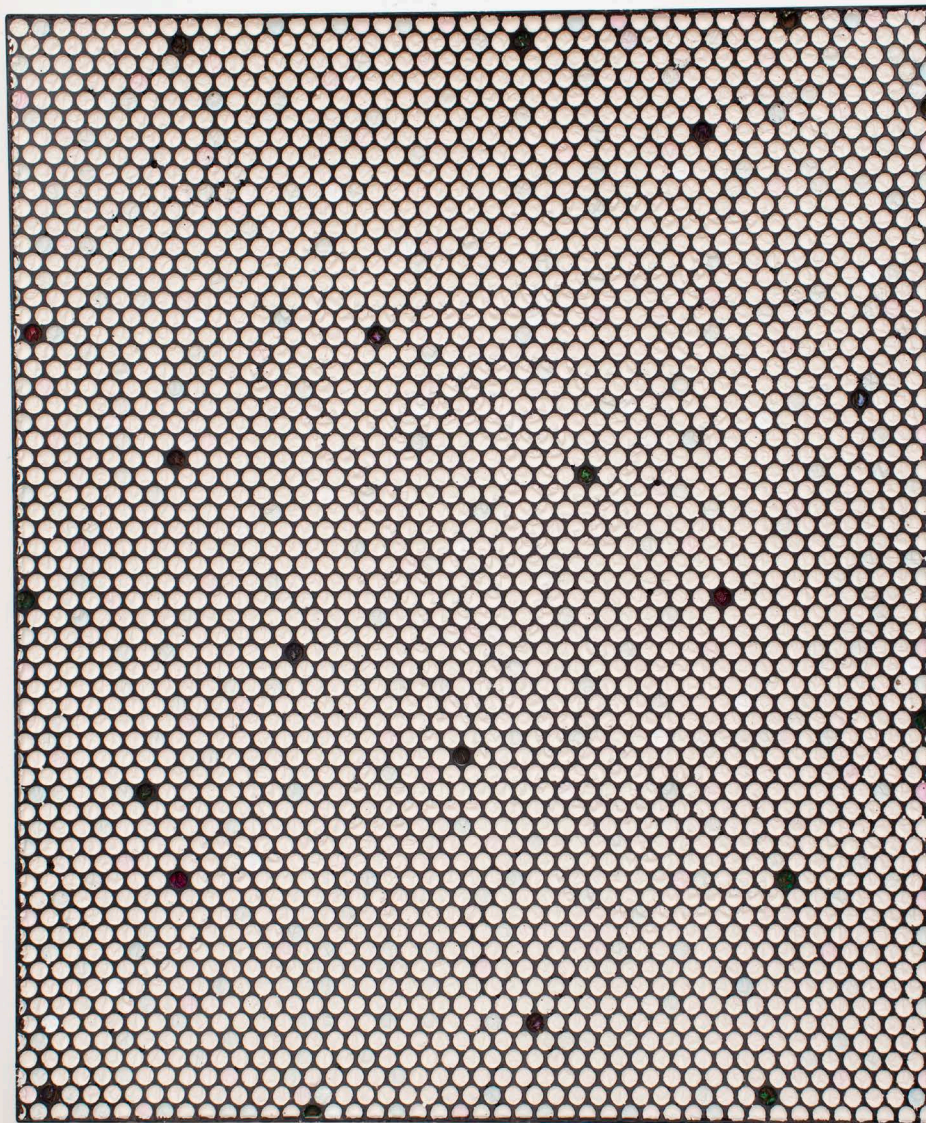

Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in 1964, Emil Lukas has exhibited throughout the United States and abroad. Solo museum shows include "Emil Lukas: Connection to the Curious" at The Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum in Ridgefield, CT (2005); "Emil Lukas" at The Weatherspoon Museum, Greensboro, NC (2005); "Things with Wings," The Mattress Factory, Pittsburgh, PA (2005); and "Moderate Climate and the Bitter Bison" at the Hunterdon Museum, Hunterdon, NJ (2008). In 2016, a solo exhibition of his work was held at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, Philadelphia, PA.
