















Evoking the timeless beauty

and mitery of nature, his works often reflect a sense of spirituality and transcendence, as well as a deep connection with the natural world. Atchugarry's work challenges the traditional conception of sculpture as a static object, encouraging interaction and the observer's gaze.

Christo and Jeanne-Claude

(b. 1935 d. 2020) (b. 1935 d. 2009)

Christo was born on June 13, 1935 in Gabrovo, Bulgaria. He left Bulgaria in 1956, first to Prague, Czechoslovakia, and then escaped to Vienna, Austria, in 1957, then moved to Geneva, Switzerland. In 1958, Christo went to Paris, where he met Jeanne-Claude Denat de Guillebon, not only his wife but life partner in the creation of monumental environmental works of art. Jeanne-Claude passed away on November 18, 2009. Christo died on May 31, 2020 at his home in New York City, where he lived for 56 years.

Fromearlywrappedobjectstomonumentaloutdoorprojects, Christo and Jeanne-Claude's artwork transcended the traditional bounds of painting, sculpture, and architecture. Some of their work included Wrapped Coast near Sydney (1968–69), Valley Curtain in Colorado (1970–72), Running Fence in California (1972–76), Surrounded Islands in Miami (1980–83), The Pont Neuf Wrapped in Paris (1975–85), The Umbrellas in Japan and California (1984-91), Wrapped Reichstag in Berlin (1972-95), The Gates in New York's Central Park (1979–2005), The Floating Piers at Italy's Lake Iseo (2014-16), and The London Mastaba on London's Serpentine Lake (2016–18).

Following the completion of L'Arc de Triomphe, Wrapped, Paris, 1961–2021, Christo and Jeanne-Claude's team has returned focus on the artists's only permanent, large-scale public artwork: The Mastaba, Project for United Arab Emirates, started in 1977.



Lucio Fontana (b. 1899 d. 1968)

Fontana is best known for his involvement in the Spatialist movement, which aimed to transcend the traditional two-dimensional nature of painting and explore the concept of space. He sought to break through the limitations of the canvas, introducing unconventional elements that challenged conventional notions of art.


One of Fontana's most significant contributions was his use of slashes and cuts on canvas. By physically puncturing the surface of the artwork, he created openings that exposed the space behind, blurring the boundaries between painting and sculpture. These radical gestures added a dynamic and interactive dimension to his works, inviting viewers to engage with the physicality of the art object.

Fontana's exploration of spatial concepts extended beyond canvas. He also experimented with sculpture and installation art, using various materials such as ceramics and metals to create immersive environments.



Pablo Atchugarry (b. 1954)

Pablo Atchugarry, is internationally renowned for his monumental public sculptures. After experimenting with a variety of materials early in his career, Atchugarry turned to marble as his primary medium. Simultaneously abstract and numinous, massive and delicately carved, his sculptures are reflections on the intervention of the spiritual in everyday life, intended to channel spiritual energies into the spaces they occupy and invite contemplation of the divine. Atchugarry is influenced by the seminal work of Constantin Brancusi and Henry Moore, and often likened to Michelangelo in his similar devotion to working with his own hands (as opposed to the workshop practices of several of his contemporaries).



Arcangelo Sassolino (b. 1990)

Sassolino's works and installations explore mechanical behaviours, materials and physical properties of force. Each work takes careful planning, research and results in constructions that are stunning both in terms of their sheer physicality (material density, mechanical precision) and the forces (gravity, pressure, friction) which are applied by or to an object. The tension and the expectation that come with the awareness of risk, play a huge role in the viewers experience, together with a strong unique aesthetic.

Arcangelo Sassolino had solo presentations at Palais de Tokyo in Paris (2008), at MACRO Museum in Rome (2011), with a special mention to the enviromental project presented in Z33 Center for Contemporary Art in Hasselt (2010) and in the context of Art and The City in Zurich (2012). His works were shown also in public institutions and collections at MART Museum in Rovereto and at Guggenheim Collection in Venice, FRAC Museum Regional of Reims, Autocenter and Mica Moca in Berlin, Tinguely Museum Basel, Fondazione Arnaldo Pomodoro in Milano.
